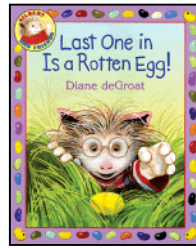


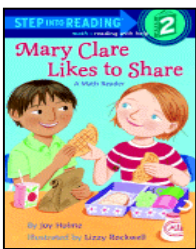

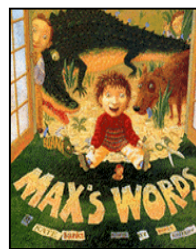
Ears by Daniel Nunn
An introduction to the ears of animals and humans, looking at their different shapes, sizes, and functions.



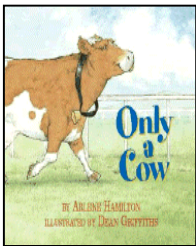
Last One is a Rotten Egg by Diane DeGroat
When Gilbert and Lola's cousin Wally comes to visit for Easter, he learns a lesson about being greedy during the annual Easter egg hunt.



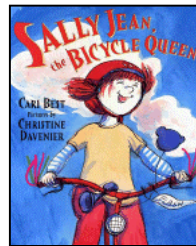
Mary Clare Likes to Share by Joy Hulme

When Max cuts out words from magazines and newspapers, collecting them the way his brothers collect stamps and coins, they all learn about words, sentences, and storytelling.



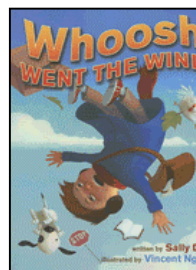
Only a Cow By Arlene Hamilton
