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ProgressBook GradeBook Reporting Periods


It is recommended to verify that your Reporting Periods and Grade Entry Windows in GradeBook are configured correctly at the end of the school year. The 2nd Semester Exam Reporting Period should have a Term Begin and Term End date that is after your last day of school. Your teachers then need to use this date as the date on their exam assignments in their GradeBooks. This date will keep the Exam 2 assignment grade separate from the Quarter 4 grade.

Grade Entry Dates

The Grade Entry window needs to be open for Quarter 4, Exam 2, Final, and if applicable, the 2nd Semester Average. The Entry Start Date and Entry End Date for these reporting periods should all be the same, as your teachers will submit these report card grades at the same time. The time of the Entry End Date defaults to 12:01 am. To accommodate this, you need to either add a day to the Entry End Date, or enter a specific time. For example, a date of 6/2/2017 in the Entry End Date field will give your teachers all day of 6/1/2017 to submit grades; a date of 6/1/2017 4:00 PM, gives your teachers until 4:00 pm on 6/1/2017.

The Publish Date is the date the Report Card grades will begin to post to the Report Card page on ParentAccess. This date does not affect the published PDF report card date.

Update on INFOhio funding and HB49

The amendment we have been working on to restore INFOhio's funding to the FY15 level now in the Substitute Budget Bill, SubHB49. **Thank you** all so much for organizing calls to your legislators and making calls yourself. Grassroots efforts go a long way!

This week, the House will vote on SubHB49. During the debate and voting, it is possible for amendments to be added that could reduce the INFOhio funding. It is critical that every Ohio House member receives many calls thanking them for the restoration of INFOhio's \$1.1 million funds for digital resources for Ohio schools in the Substitute Budget Bill and asking them to retain INFOhio's full funding in the SubHB49.

We have been advised by legislators who have submitted the amendment that calls and emails are needed until the budget is signed by the governor, in June.

Your Action is needed IMMEDIATELY.

It is critical that every one of the Ohio House members receive many calls regarding sustaining the funding for INFOhio in SubHB49.
