
Student Services Hints & Tips

CRDC—Civil Rights Data Collection - Current Status

With the recent announcement of the Civil Rights Data Collection window being opened we have been informed by Software-Answers that the new Student Information Civil Rights reporting procedures are currently being tested. Once approved they will be made available to the ITCs in the next hot fix release.

Please note that you have 75 days from the date the ODE CRDC window was opened (April 16th) in which to send your data.

An email notification will be sent once we know when this hot fix is available and a date/time of installation has been determined. We will continue to keep you posted as more information is shared with us.

INFOhio - Beach Bags and Camp INFOHIO

Summer Fun with Beach Bags and Camp INFOhio!

Parents have an easy, fun way to keep their children's reading skills sharp this summer with four new "Beach Bags" for K-3 and the first ever Camp INFOhio for grades 4-6.

The Beach Bags feature stories and activities that let children practice reading skills while learning about careers and helping the environment.

The Beach Bags are: <u>Explore the World of Work: Police Officer</u> <u>Explore the World of Work: President</u> <u>Explore the World of Work: Veterinarian</u> Where Does the Garbage Go?



<u>Camp INFOhio</u> contains five days of reading, activities, and experiments centered on STEAM topics. STEAM stands for Science, Technology, Engineering, the Arts, and Math. Kids can try their hand at code breaking, conduct science experiments with items they find in the kitchen, learn about roller coasters before designing their own, and create their own musical instruments.
