Graduation Points

A new page will be coming in StudentInformation that will track where each student is in their grad path. This page will cover the state requirements. At this time we do not know the exact date of the release for this new page, however we have been told to expect it this school year.

How can you track Grad Points now?

The Assessment History Export in Harmony exports the Grad Points for the End of Course Exams, as well as the Grad Points Total for each student. We recently worked with a school district to get our logic for the Grad Points Total correct for the different student assessment combinations.

Reminder: You can Select a Subset of Students to run the Assessment History Export for one or more students in your building.

Outstanding Issue: Defect 11194

Using the Print function, the font is larger causing multiple pages to print. This defect was included in a prior release, however not all pages were fixed and the defect has been reactivated. At this time this defect does not have a future release assigned to it.

- 4. Click Put in newspaper format. Repeat for each of your honor roll lists.



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Book Nook is a site devoted to student-created book trailers. The site is open to all Ohio K-12 students. Check out the <u>quidelines and rubric for submission</u>. Then when the book trailer is finished, just complete the short <u>submission form</u>. The Book Nook team will review the content within five days.

Students can submit their work or teachers and librarians can submit on behalf of students, but the book trailer needs to be done by kids for kids. And if you've never made a book trailer, never fear because Book Nook includes links to resources for teachers and students to spark creativity and guide them through the development process.

Students will find links to sites that help them:

- Plan a book trailer project
- Find royalty free images and music
- · Create the video
- Cite their sources

Teachers will find additional links that help them:

- Plan lessons around book trailers, regardless of the subject area
- Develop rubrics to grade them
- Add a book trailer to their library catalog
